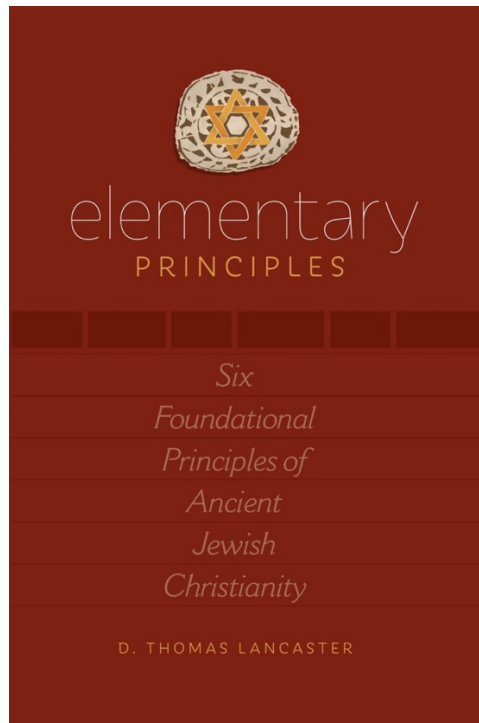


Elementary Principles

Hebrews 6:1-3

Six Foundational Principles of Ancient Jewish Christianity

Q: What is sin?

A: Transgression of the commandments of the Torah.

1 John 3:4

Everyone who practices sin also practices Torah-lessness, and sin is Torah-lessness.

Q: Wat are “dead” works?

A: Any works, righteous or not, that do not bear ^{lasting} ~~good~~ fruit.

1 Corinthians 3:13-15

Each man's work will become evident, for the day will show it because it is to be revealed with fire, and the fire itself will test the quality of each man's work. If any man's work which he has built on it remains, he will receive a reward. If any man's work is burned up, he will suffer loss, but he himself will be saved, yet so as through fire.

Matthew 22:11-13

“But when the king came in to look over the dinner guests, he saw a man there who was not dressed in wedding clothes, and he said to him, ‘Friend, how did you come in here without wedding clothes?’ And the

man was speechless. Then the king said to the servants, 'Bind him hand and foot, and throw him into the outer darkness; in that place there will be weeping and gnashing of teeth.'”

Revelation 19:7-9
