

- Abraham willing to sacrifice his son
- "bound"
- Death by sacrifice
- Rescued
- Answered by an angel
- "Do not stretch out your hand"
- A. "raised" his eyes
- God provides a ram
- "All nations will bless
  themselves by your seed..."
  - Isaac's bride is born

# "Under the Torah"

Examples of Paul's use of the phrase "under the Torah":

- "Under the Torah" as opposed to having the Torah written on their hearts.
- Legalism, especially the additional rabbinic enactments. (The phrase is used this way in the Dead Sea Scrolls)
- Under the condemnation that the Torah pronounces against sin.
- The relationship of the Jewish people to the written Torah apart from the Spirit of Torah or the Torah-made-flesh.

But under **no** circumstances does "under the Torah" mean obedience to the Torah.
