Prerequisite Principles

- Never assume you understand Bible prophecy.
- Often, our motives for studying Bible prophecy are tainted by ...
 - Fear
 - PrideDesire for power

Anger

- We are confined in time. God is not.
- Bible prophecy has two overarching themes:
 - There will be a period of great darkness followed by a time of great light. (Daniel 7:11-14)
 - Prepare yourself! You will stand before God to be judged. (Matt.24:42-51)

Two Questions:

Q#1: "When will these things happen?"

Answer: Matthew 24:15-28

Q#2: "What will be the sign of Your coming, and of the end of the age?"

Answer: Matthew 24:29-41

- a) Many will come claiming to be the Messiah and will mislead many
- b) Wars, rumors of wars (nations...kingdoms)
- c) Famines
- d) Earthquakes

(Only the beginning of birth pains)

- e) Widespread persecution of believers
- f) Many will fall away and betray one another
- g) Many false prophets will arise and mislead many
- h) Disobedience to Torah will lead to diminished love
- i) The "Gospel of the Kingdom" proclaimed to the world (?)

Luke 2:1

In those days a decree went out from Caesar Augustus that all the world (οἰκουμένη) should be registered.

Acts 11:28

And one of them named Agabus stood up and foretold by the spirit that there would be a great famine over all the world (this took place in the days of Claudius).

Acts 17:6

And when they could not find them, they dragged Jason and some of the brothers before the city authorities, shouting, "These men who have turned **the world** upside down have come here also."

2 Thessalonians 2:3-4

Let no one deceive you in any way. For that day will not come, unless the rebellion comes first, and the man of Torah-lessness is revealed, the son of destruction, who opposes and exalts himself **against every so-called god** or object of worship, so that he takes his seat in the temple of God, proclaiming himself to be God.

Luke 21:20

"But when you see Jerusalem surrounded by armies, then know that its desolation has come near."

The "Abomination of Desolation"

Daniel 9:27 / 11:31

... And on the wing of **abominations** shall come one who makes **desolate**, until the decreed end is poured out on the desolator...Forces from him shall appear and profane the Temple and fortress, and shall take away the regular burnt offering. And they shall set up the **abomination that makes desolate**.



1 Maccabees 1:54-57

On the fifteenth day of *Chislev* in the year [165 BC] the king built the **desolating abomination** on top of the altar of burnt offering; and altars were built in the surrounding towns of Judah and incense offered at the doors of houses and in the streets. Any books of the Torah that came to light were torn up and burned. Whenever anyone was discovered possessing a copy of the covenant or practicing the Torah, the king's decree sentenced him to death.

Matthew 24:15-16

"So when you see the **abomination of desolation** spoken of by the prophet Daniel, standing in the holy place (let the reader understand), then let those who are in Judea flee to the mountains.



Luke 17:35-37
